# **Post-Operative Review Appointment Details:**

	IMPORTANT AFTER CARE INFORMATION:
•	Avoid heavy rubbing or any bumping of the eye for the first month after surgery.
	You may experience double vision within the first 12 hours following surgery.
	Avoid sustained bending or lifting of heavy objects.
	You should not experience any pain beyond some mild irritation or discomfort.
	If you do feel pain contact Dr McGrath's Rooms immediately!
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•	Panadol or Panamax should be all that is necessary to ease your discomfort.
	<u>EYE DROPS</u>
You	have TWO (2) bottles of eye drops to use:
<u>CHL</u>	LORSIG
And	d and a second and
PRE	EDNEFRIN FORTE (shake bottle well prior to use)!
9	ON THE DAY OF SURGERY
	Start your eye drops after surgery when you arrive home
	(use the CHLORSIG first then the PREDNEFRIN FORTE remembering to shake well)
l	Use both eye drops everyhours until bedtime.
	THE DAY AFTER SURGERY
	The first TWO (2) weeks following surgery:
	Instil <b>ONE</b> drop from each bottle into the operated eye 4 times a day.
1	Easy times to remember are at breakfast, lunch, dinner and prior to going to bed.
	Use the <b>CHLORSIG</b> first, & after instilling the drop, gently close your eye for a few

seconds & wait at least 2 minutes before using the **PREDNEFRIN FORTE** 



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# Week THREE (3) and Week FOUR (4) following surgery:

## **STOP** using **CHLORSIG**

Continue to use the **PREDNEFRIN FORTE** 2 x per day for a further **TWO** (2) weeks.

#### **PARACETAMOL**

d not be taken before
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#### **HYGIENE**

Clean eyelashes daily by rubbing gently with fingertips while showering.

Avoid soap or shampoo in the eye

No eye makeup for 1 week

Wear the eye shield only if directed by the Doctor.

### **ACTIVITIES**

**DO NOT DRIVE** until instructed by Doctor.

No Swimming for 1 month.

You can return to your normal activities (eg bowls) without concern.

### **GLASSES**

You may use your current glasses, if you find them useful until you visit your Optometrist in FOUR (4) weeks

## **FOLLOW UP**

If your eye becomes more red, increasingly uncomfortable / painful or your vision has worsened, please contact Dr McGrath for a check immediately.
